OUR START TO THE 2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Literacy: We have introduced 'The First 20 Days of Reading' program to develop the protocols of how reading looks and works at Yaapeet Primary School. The students are enjoying creating Anchor Charts and using the library as an additional learning space.

Students have practised handwriting skills using the dotted thirds pages in their year level books, writing recounts to the published stage. Students have commenced the 'Words Their Way' spelling program. The analysis of spelling tests has identified 6 levels of students who will now be working at targeted 'point of need' spelling rules and features at their applicable levels.

Numeracy: We have been working on reading and naming numbers up to 7 digits. This was an area that was highlighted during the Mathematics Online testing as a point of need. We have moved onto comparing and ordering numbers while the senior students are developing proficiencies in understanding multiplication, factors, multiples and the relationship between multiplication and division.

Inquiry: Our topic this term is 'All About Me and My Community' & Respectful Relationships program.

PE/Sport/Health: Students will participate in Tennis and Cricket for Term 1. We have commenced our swimming program in Horsham and we will also be participating in Cluster Swimming Carnivals over the next few weeks with the first one at Rainbow on Friday 14/02/20 and the next level at Hope-toun on the 21/02/20.
