Victorian Premier—COVID-19 Update in relation to current Stage 3 easing of restrictions :

Can I have visitors in my home? And do babies and kids count?

Yes.

You can have up to five visitors to your home at any one time, in addition to those who normally live there. Children are counted in the total person limit.

Victorians are being asked to use common sense when it comes to visiting friends and family, especially those who are more vulnerable. That means seeing those you need to – if you need to.

Can I go to the park?

Yes.

You can relax at the park, have a picnic or play non-contact sports. Keep at least 1.5m between yourself and anyone from outside your household at all times.

You can meet up with friends and family outdoors but only in groups of up to 10 people. Playgrounds, outdoor gyms and skate parks all remain closed.

And please don't drink from public drinking fountains or use public BBQs.

Can I drive a bit further to go exercise? Can I go to a national park?

Yes, you can drive to another location to exercise.

Under the new directions, parks may reopen for hiking and other recreational activities, but you cannot gather in groups of more than 10 people at any one time.

Camping is still prohibited.

STUDENTS TO RETURN TO SCHOOL IN TERM 2!

This is very exciting news for students, staff and families. I really enjoyed contacting each of our families last Monday to confirm that students would be returning prior to the end of term 2. The responses from families were positive and full of excitement.

I am also very pleased to see the easing of other restrictions so families and friends can once again share some time together. Mrs Dianne Phelan is very excited about seeing her new grandson, Peyton, who is now 8 weeks old, for the very first time.

Current DET information regarding 'Return to School' are the guidelines that all schools will implement. Important information about this transition to on-site schooling is as follows:

- ◆ All staff will resume working onsite from Monday 25/5/20, exceptions for staff identified in high risk categories
- ◆ Students in Year Prep—2 will resume on Tuesday 26/5/20
- ◆ Students in Year 3—6 will resume on Tuesday 9/6/20
- ◆ Enhanced hygiene practice and cleaning on school sites - extended and increased cleaning arrangements are in place
- ◆ Voluntary COVID-19 testing for staff
- ◆ Playground equipment can be used however students to practise hand hygiene before and after use. Playgrounds will be wiped down as part of the school cleaning program.
- ◆ Students to bring their own water bottles to school and should not drink directly from drinking fountains at this time.
- ◆ Physical distancing for staff: management of how staff move through and work in—classrooms, staffrooms, offices and reception areas.
- ◆ Hand sanitiser—to be easily accessed for all staff and students .
- ◆ Limited visitors to school may include staggering drop off and pick up times.
- ◆ Return of all technology that has been borrowed to be returned to school site by each student
